“STRENGTHEN YOUR BRETHERN” (Luke 22:32)

December 8 is the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, a Holy Day of Obligation for us to assist at Mass. In our parishes we observe this Solemnity with a **Vigil Mass on Sunday at 8:00 PM at Elmwood and on Monday at 8:00 AM at Spring Valley and 6:00 PM in Boyceville**. Under her title as the Immaculate Conception Mary is invoked as patroness of our country. Come and beg Mary -- given to us by her Divine Son from the Cross to be our Mother too -- to intercede specially for our families, our parishes, the Church, and our nation.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* summarizes the rich meaning of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary: “To become the **mother of the Savior**, Mary ‘was enriched by God with gifts appropriate to such a role.’ The **angel Gabriel at the moment of the Annunciation salutes her as ‘full of grace’** (Luke 1:28). In fact, in order for Mary to be able to give the free assent of her faith to the announcement of her vocation, it was necessary that she be wholly borne by God’s grace” (490).

From this fundamental scriptural truth, the *Catechism* notes that: “through the centuries the Church has become ever more aware that **Mary, ‘full of grace,’ through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception**. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Pope Pius IX proclaimed in 1854: ‘The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin’” (491). The *Catechism* expands on what this means: “The ‘splendor of an entirely unique holiness’ by which Mary is ‘enriched from the first instant of her conception’ comes **wholly from Christ**: she is ‘redeemed, in a more exalted fashion, by reason of the merits of her Son.’ The **Father blessed Mary** more than any other created person ‘in Christ with every spiritual blessings in the heavenly places’ and chose her ‘in Christ before the foundation of the world, to be holy and blameless before Him in love’” (492).

Finally, the *Catechism* summarizes noting that “the Fathers of the Eastern tradition call the Mother of God ‘the All-Holy’ (*Panagia*) and celebrate her as ‘free from any stain of sin, as though **fashioned by the Holy Spirit and formed as a new creature**.’ **By the grace of God Mary remained free of every personal sin her whole life long**” (493).

On this great feast day we pray: “O God, who by the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin prepared a worthy dwelling for your Son, grant, we pray, that, as you preserved her from every stain by virtue of the Death of your Son, which you foresaw, so, through her intercession, we, too, may be cleansed and admitted to your presence” (Collect).

The additional responsibilities given to me by Bishop Callahan have me travelling every week of December! This weekend (Friday and Saturday) is the usual Deacon Formation Program at Marathon City. This coming week is the meeting of all the Deans with the Bishop at the Diocesan Center in La Crosse. The week after that is the meeting of the Presbyteral Council (Priest Senate) with the Bishop in La Crosse. The week of Christmas is the Seminary Admissions Board interviewing prospective seminarians at the Diocesan Center. And the week after Christmas is the Bishop’s Annual Seminarian Family gathering in La Crosse. At this time last year I purchased a new car as my other one had begun to fail. That was a good investment! Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us! Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception, pray for us!
