With our climate, the months of December and January tend to be very hard on those who have grown infirm because of age or illness. Requests for the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** increase at this time of year. In recent weeks I have been called celebrate this sacrament – for our parishioners and for others whose Pastor was unavailable – in homes and in area nursing homes and hospitals. For most of these souls, the gift of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick was the consolation of having their sins forgiven and knowing that Jesus Christ accompanied them in the final hours of their earthly journey. **Celebrating this sacrament with the infirm and dying is one of the great joys of being a Priest.** Death, too, seems to call more often during the depths of Winter. Moreover, no matter what the time of year, deaths seem to come in bunches of three. That has been the case as each of our three parishes celebrated the **Funeral Rites of the Church** in recent weeks. Just as I administered the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to members of other parishes whose Pastor was unavailable, in addition to the funerals of parishioners this week found me also celebrated a Funeral Mass in a neighboring parish. Once again we see that principle at work of which I wrote in this column in the Fall. Although the Bishop entrusts a specific group of people – members of a parish – to the care of a particular Priest as Pastor, nevertheless **every Priest as part of the diocesan college or body of Priests (called the presbyterate) stands ready to meet the pastoral needs of anyone should the Pastor be unavailable.** And with most Priests shepherding multiple parishes plus having responsibilities beyond their communities, the lay faithful today appreciate just how common it is to have their spiritual needs met by the “team” of diocesan Priests! Please pray for your Priests as they daily pray for you.

Speaking of praying for Priests, one of our parishioners brought to our three parishes a new spiritual work called the **Seven Sisters Apostolate**. In 2010 a member of the Cathedral Parish in Saint Paul discerned that God was calling her to pray one hour each week for her Pastor, the Rector of the Cathedral. Eventually the Lord led her to invite other women to pray a Holy Hour for the Pastor so that on every day of the week there was one woman spending an hour in prayer specifically and exclusively for the Pastor – thus the name Seven Sisters. When one of our parishioners approached me to begin the Seven Sisters Apostolate in our parishes I wholeheartedly approved! So for several months, now, women from our parishes have been offering this spiritual service each day praying for my deeper conversion to the Lord and that I continue to grow in holiness. What a consolation and a gift for me to know that every day one of my sisters in Christ is spending one hour with our Eucharistic Lord begging Him to draw me closer to Himself! Speaking of intercessory prayer, please **keep in your prayers the four individuals who are diligently preparing to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Faith.** One high school student, one young adult, and two men who are husbands and fathers are currently on that path leading to embracing the fullness of Catholic Faith. Because each one is proceeding at the pace appropriate for his or her individual circumstances, they will not all be received into full communion at the same time. Pray that God, who has begun this good work in them, may bring it to completion!

Continuing with the theme of prayer, the **high point and center of our year of faith as parishes is the celebration of the Lord Jesus Christ's saving Death and Resurrection in the Church's liturgies of Holy Week.** Each of our parishes takes a turn being the site where as a community of parishes we can gather to celebrate these most sacred days. This year the **liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday will be at Saint Luke Parish in Boyceville.** As usual, the good people of Boyceville have responded with great enthusiasm and pride to be able to offer themselves and their church in service to us all as we celebrate the wondrous gift of our salvation! Easter Sunday morning Masses will be celebrated at Spring Valley and Elmwood.
