**Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time**

St. Augustine mentioned three virtues as indispensable to being moved by the Holy Spirit and filled with His power and be enkindled with the fire of His love. These three virtues are: humility, humility and humility.

While I am reflecting on today’s readings, the key word that emerged was humility. That is why I’ll focus my reflection on the virtue of humility. Humility, the virtue recommended to us, is a wise and saintly basic virtue of Christian life. It is the one virtue which our Lord told us to copy from Him as He asks us to learn from Him for He is meek and humble of heart.

The Book of Sirach, our first reading, teaches us that if we perform our tasks with humility those whom God accepts will love us. The greater we are, the more we must humble ourselves so we will find favor in the sight of the Lord, (vv.17-18).

Today’s Second Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews advises us not to relapse into the old ways, indicating the time prior to conversion. We are encouraged to persevere to the end of the path that leads us to our heavenly inheritance.

Today’s gospel reading we heard Jesus talking about where the guests should sit at the table when invited somewhere. As a general rule in a fixed system, the most distinguished guest sits at the right hand of the host where he receives the highest honor. The second most important guest sits at the left side of the host and so on. While Jesus was aware of this fixed system, He was not presenting a lesson in social etiquette. He used this example of good manners at the table to draw attention to how honor is accredited in the Kingdom of God. This parable and the entire gospel talk to us about the need to be humble.

*I Am Third* is the title of the bestselling autobiography of Gale Sayers who ranks among the greatest running backs in the whole history of American football. In his book Gale says why these three words mean so much to him. They were the motto of his track coach who kept the words on a little sign on his desk. One day Gale asked him what they meant. The coach replied: “The Lord is the first, my friends are second and I am third.” From that day on, Gale made those words his own philosophy of life, bought a gold medal, had the words “I Am Third” engraved on it and wore it around his neck ever since, like a religious symbol.

While watching a television Mass, it so happened that the priest-celebrant beautifully gave meaning to every letter of the word THIRD and I will add some of what he said. He said that T stands for Thankfulness. The original Old English word for thankfulness is: “*to think full*”. We should think of the graces God has given to us and thank Him. H stands for Humility. We should be humble as Jesus teaches us today. I stands for Integrity. Integrity simply means incorruptibility. It is a moral courage to do the right thing in the face of personal risk of social pressure. It also refers to firm adherence to the moral/ethical code. And when we talk of moral/ethical, it has to do with the standard or principle of right behavior. R stands for Responsibility or the quality of being responsible. It is the knowledge that we have to do our work faithfully and courageously. We know that we have to be humble but we do not do it. And D stands for Docility or faithfulness to God.

If we want to learn humilty, we should imitate the life of Our Lord Jesus Christ. He lived for 33 years and thirty of those years were spent out of the public eye. At the end of His ministry He was humiliated and despised. He is humble, always defended the poor and destitute and never praised Himself.
